Legal requirements and information.

Public Liability

Rainbow Amusement Park is covered by Public Liability Insurance to the amount of £10 million. The Policy is with "Park Insurance".

Local Enforcement Agency

Rainbow Amusement Park is enforced by the Health and Safety Executive (rides & attractions), Environmental Health Department (refreshment kiosks).

Rides Maintenance/Operation

All rides are maintained and operated in accordance with the Health & Safety Executive document HSG175 entitled "Fairground and Amusement Parks – Guidance on Safe Practice".

Food Safety and Hygiene

Refreshment kiosks at the park are operated in accordance with strict hygiene standards comply with the Food Safety Act 1990. Regular inspections are carried by the local Environmental Health Authority.

Parking

There is ample car / coach parking facilities available. These are run by the local council.

First aid

Various members of the team are trained in basic first aid. There is also a fully equipped first aid station located on the promenade. The nearest hospital is 14 miles from the Park.

Emergency planning

In the event of an emergency please follow all evacuation procedures given by staff.

Fire safety

There are fire extinguishers at various locations around the park. These are inspected annually.

Arrival arrangements

The main contact point is the Dodgem pay box. Please make sure a group leader makes us aware of your arrival to Rainbow Park at this meeting point prior to riding any of the attractions.

Disabled access

Rainbow Amusement Park welcomes visits from disabled guests and will do all that is possible to ensure they have a safe and enjoyable visit. However certain rides and attractions at the park can be physically demanding and vigorous. We therefore reserve the right to refuse admission to certain rides should we feel that there is a risk to a particular individual or individuals. We have been advised by the Health & Safety Executive that refusal on the grounds of Health & Safety does not constitute discrimination.

Lost children

We recommend the Dodgem pay box as our lost children point. This should be shown to children on arrival. Children should approach a member of staff if they are unsure of the location.

Unruly visitors

We do expect all visitors to behave appropriately. There are rules and procedures in place on all rides. We expect guests to follow instruction when given, by members of staff. Staff are trained to enforce these regulations for the benefit of all guests. Staff will instruct guests to behave where necessary and may remove a rider from a ride if required. Or the park if essential.

Age / height restrictions

There is no minimum age restriction in respect of entry to Rainbow Amusement Park. However height restrictions do apply on some rides and there may be a list of other safety related restrictions (dependent on the ride) and general information at the entry point to an attraction which must be adhered to.

Eating facilities

There are several refreshment kiosks within Rainbow Amusement Park where food can be purchased. A variety of hot and cold food is available.

Additional Costs

In addition to the rides there are various outlets, stalls, games and arcades.

Welfare facilities

Council run Toilets are located directly opposite Rainbow Amusement Park on the car park.
