This document is a summary of the information that we can provide to you as a group leader to reassure you that safety is our main priority and provide you and your group with a safe and enjoyable visit to Rainbow Park. Please remember that a safe ride starts with a safe rider!

For your further information - As a member of The Showmen's Guild of Great Britain, which was founded in 1889, Rainbow Park benefits from the most up to date safety information available in the industry. The Guild places a very high value on the maintenance of proper safety precautions and played a large part in the drafting of the Code of Safe Practice at Fairs, published by the Health and Safety Executive in 1984. This is one of the most comprehensive safety manuals for the industry ever produced. Since its introduction, the Executive has published the first titles in a projected series of safety manuals covering individual types of fairground rides, again with the active co-operation of the Guild. Using information from the Safety Guidance for Fairgrounds and Amusement Parks (HSG 175), produced by the Health & Safety Executive, The Showmen's Guild of Great Britain has ensured that its members are updated with all aspects of safety relating to their operations. Amongst the foremost practices on safety is the production and regular review of risk assessments for all rides and attractions. Group Organisers can be assured that when considering a visit to our park this vital requirement will be in place.

No ride or attraction can be opened to members of the public unless a Declaration of Conformity Certificate (DOC) has been issued. DOCs are only issued after the ride or attraction has been subjected to an initial inspection and thereafter, an annual inspection by an independent body registered under the Amusement Devices Inspection Procedures Scheme (ADIPS). This is an extremely comprehensive assessment process which covers all safety related matters, such as height restrictions, operating systems, safety restraints, electrical inspections etc.

Furthermore, all our rides and attractions are extensively checked daily by ourselves to ensure continued safety on each ride and attraction. In addition to the daily inspections carried out, operational checks are carried out by the ride operator prior to the park opening to the public. The operation of all rides and attractions on the park conform to documented operational procedures. The operational procedures are produced using information supplied from the manufacturers' guidelines, supplementary information supplied on issue of the DOC and results/information found while conducting the risk assessment on each ride and attraction. Both the operational procedures and risk assessments are individually reviewed on a regular basis using all available information. Rainbow Park requires that all ride operators have a high level of competence for each ride and attraction that they operate. All ride training is based on the operating procedures written individually for each ride and attraction and is reviewed as needed.
